The CILIP Kate Greenaway and Carnegie Children's Book Awards and Arts Award

Are you running a Kate Greenaway or Carnegie shadowing group?

Did you know that you can deliver Arts Award at the same time, and accredit you group's participation?

What is Arts Award?

Arts Award is a series of nationally recognised portfolio based qualifications, regulated on the RQF, designed to support young people to grow as artists and arts leaders. Starting at Discover (for KS1/2) and running to Gold (KS4/5) young people aged up to 25 can complete their award in any art form, including literature! Completing an Arts Award has been demonstrated to improve confidence, metacognition and broaden horizons for young people of all abilities and backgrounds.

Why do Arts Award?

Not only does Arts Award give young people a qualification that they can take to future education and employment, it is a valuable tool to help promote the next generation of artists and arts-lovers - and maybe the next Greenaway or Carnegie winner! How to run Arts Award alongside CILIP Kate Greenaway or Carnegie shadowing

At its heart, Arts Award has three key areas:

- 1. Taking Part.** Young people need to take an active part in an arts activity - like reading a book!
- 2. Finding out.** Young people need to find out about artists and their work, and for some levels an arts organisation as well.
- 3. Sharing.** Young people need to share what they have learnt and achieved, and at higher levels reflect on their progress.



Get started with Arts Award

- Step 1:** train as an Arts Award adviser to enable you to run the Award artsaward.org.uk/booktraining
- Step 2:** choose your level. We recommend that Discover maps perfectly to the Kate Greenaway Award, while Bronze is ideal to link to the Carnegie Medal
- Step 3:** plan your delivery. Use our free templates and support offer to help get started artsaward.org.uk/support
